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William Cannon Wreath Laying:

Every year, the Oregon Society Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) Color Guard honors William Cannon, the only Revolutionary War Patriot buried in Oregon and Washington, by laying a wreath from the Wreath Across America program on his grave in St. Paul's Cemetery. On December 17, 2023, members of SAR, the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), and Children of the American Revolution (CAR), placed the wreath on Cannon's tombstone. This was followed by a musket volley salute. Gerry Lenzen, Connie Lenzen, and K'Lyn Brentano represented the St. Paul Mission Historical Society.

"The 30 August, 1854, by us Archbishop undersigned has been buried in the cemetery of this mission the body of William Canon, widower of a Chinouk woman, deceased supplied with the Sacraments of the Church yesterday aged 97 years. Present Cuthbert Lambert and Casimire Gardipy who could not sign.

Catholic Sentinel Articles About the St. Paul Area:

In 1869, the first issue of the *Catholic Sentinel* newspaper was published. Issues from February 1870 have been scanned and placed online at <u>http://www.catholicsentinel.org</u>. From the very beginning St. Paul had an agent for the newspaper. Matthew Murphy served as the first agent. Before long, news of St. Paul residents appeared in the paper. Samples are shown below.

18 March 1871, p. 3, col. 1

A Splendid Opportunity. - Our readers will notice among our new advertisements, that of the Old Mission Farm, within three miles of St. Paul, Marion county, Oregon. St. Paul lies in one of the richest agricultural parts of the Willamette valley, about one mile east of the river. It is surrounded with some of the finest farms and farmlands, interspersed with meadows and woodland. The Catholic church, from which the place takes its name, St. Paul's is the largest in the State and the only brick Catholic Church in Oregon. The interior of this church, of which Rev. G. C. Glorieux, a young and talented priest is pastor, compares favorably with churches in larger places. Adjoining the church is the pastor's residence, a neat frame building, and immediately opposite the schoolhouse, where the boys are taught. The Convent of the Sisters of the Holy Names is situated within a quarter of a mile of the church. Here the children and young ladies of the neighborhood are taught both spiritual and temporal knowledge, as only those ladies of piety and goodness, the Sisters, can teach. The population of the place and surrounding country comprises Irish, Canadian and German Catholics - the first, we believe, are in the majority. They are of the best class of people - honest, industrious, religious and intelligent. Any one settling among these people will never have occasion to be sorry for it. There is a gristmill within a mile or two of the place, (the Mission Mills,) the productions of which are not surpassed by any other in the State. There are other establishments of mechanical pursuits, which compare favorably with any in the State. The medical profession is ably represented by Doctors Bailey and Brentano. We could not wish any one, or a number of families, wishing to purchase well-cultivated farms, a better place to live than in the vicinity of St. Paul, Oregon.

15 January 1875, p. 5 Died: At St. Paul, Oregon, on the 29th day of December, 1874, Thomas Kirk, native of Clogherhead, County Louth, Ireland, aged 86 years. Eastern papers please copy. Deceased was an uncle of the present Member from Louth, G. H. Kirk.

15 December 1887, p.5

7 November 1889, p. 5 H. G. Kirkpatrick, Esq., of Colville, was united in marriage at St. Paul, Oregon, to Miss Mary E. Davidson, of St Paul, last Wednesday, Rev. F. X. Blanchet officiating.

2 December 1920, p. 8

On Wednesday, November 17, Ted Van Dyke, a prominent young farmer of this vicinity, was married to Miss Petronella Vanderhey of Forest Grove. The young couple will live on a farm near St. Paul. Mr. and Mrs. Peter Bernard, Philip Wolf, Herman Waltz, and Freeman and Ray Manegre motored over for the wedding dance.

Louise Kirk and Leona Davidson were home for the holidays. Adeline Buyserie and Grace Wolf were home for the holidays. 19 February 1920, p. 8.

Brentano House Restoration:

The gutters and downspouts were re-installed, after being taken off for painting. The refurbished gable ornament was painted and has been installed (see picture). We are working on a formal inside budget to move forward with the inside renovations.

Additional funding is needed to complete the inside renovation. A detailed budget for the inside work has been completed. Work will proceed as funding becomes available.

Specific items to be included for the interior work will be: ADA accessibility, water and sewer hookup to city services, updated electrical, restore original fir flooring, asbestos removal, drywall, plumbing, paint, and heating. The bathroom area will consist of toilet and sink only, and the kitchen area will be sink and coffee area only. These updates and repairs will allow for safe use and access for the public.

Emma Jean Abderhalden (July 5, 1932 - September 12, 2023)

Emma Jean Abderhalden passed away September 12, 2023. She was born July 5, 1932 in McMinnville, Oregon. Jean grew up in Sheridan and graduated from high school there in 1950. Around this time, she met Frank Abderhalden through a mutual friend. They were married March 9, 1951 in Sheridan, Oregon. This past March they celebrated their 72nd wedding anniversary. In April of 1952 they welcomed their daughter, Dona. In 1954, daughter Patti was born. Their son, David, joined the family in 1965.

The family lived near Sheridan for a few years before moving to St. Paul, Oregon in 1958, where they began working a farm owned by Frank's parents. Jean was the quintessential farm wife. In her 40 years as a

Joe and Rosella McKay Service Award:

In 2023, the St. Paul Mission Historical Society established the Joe and Rosella McKay Award for Service to the Society as a way to honor individuals who have performed outstanding service to the Society. The award is limited to one living person per year, except in the case where a pair of members has worked together. The number of deceased individuals shall be made at the Board's discretion.

The awardee[s] will have their name inscribed on a plaque in the Murphy House and will receive an Award certificate at the October annual meeting and brunch. Their biography will be printed in the Spring Newsletter. If they are not currently a dues paying or Life member of the Society, they will receive an Honorary Membership.

Any dues paying or Life member of the Society may make a nomination, and the awardee will be selected from the nominations by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. Nominees must have a well-documented history of Service, Leadership, or Accomplishment to the Society over a long time period.

Procedure: Any Society member may nominate an individual for the award in writing. A nomination must be submitted to the Society President, and should include:

- individual's name and contact information,
- list of services, activities, positions and accomplishments,
- narrative describing the nature of their work in terms of its importance to the Society, and a
- short biography.

All areas of service should be examined and may include, but not be limited to:

- service as a board member,
- chair of a major committee or project,
- research and writing,
- significant fund raising, or,
- other responsibilities.

The Board will review the nominee information and may also consider nominations carried forward from a previous year. The Board will select the individual who in their judgment is the most deserving. The Board may decline to select an awardee if the available nominations are found to be inadequate, or if no nominations are received.

Information submitted for nominees who were not selected for the award will be retained by the secretary for possible use in future years by the Board. Prior to publication of the award, an official biography will be prepared from the data submitted in the nomination. It will be presented to the awardee for verification.

Schedule for nomination process:

- Spring. Newsletter announcement about nominations, including criteria.
- June 1st: Nominations presented to Board.
- July Board meeting; Review the nominations.
- August Board meeting: Board acts to select a nominee. Plaque and certificate prepared.
- October: Award presentation at the Annual Meeting.
- Spring: Publication of official biography in the newsletter.
